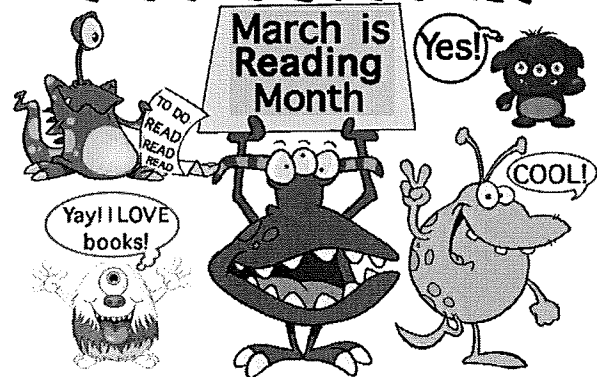

**Sensitive Issues:** We live in a time in which school violence has reached the front page of the news so many times. When we review other schools' response to such tragedies, it is often discovered that the student(s) responsible told others in person or via social media that they were planning a violent event, and yet schools and law enforcement didn't do enough to prevent the ensuing violence. For this reason, schools and law enforcement are very reactive to threats of violence of any kind.

Over the years, I have tried very hard to know and understand each student at SSPP. I know who cannot control their mouths when they get angry and have made allowances as such. I have asked myself many times a day, "What Would Jesus Do?" Jesus was not big on zero tolerance. He was big on understanding and forgiveness. Going forward, however, I feel compelled to react strongly to any such comments of violence.

Please talk to your children and be sure they understand that making comments made at school or on social media about hurting, shooting, killing, etc. will result in school consequences up to and including suspension and/or expulsion (repeated incidents), even if it is determined that they don't have the means to follow through on their threats.
