
**SSPP Spirit of Giving:** For many decades, the students and families have been donating non-perishable goods at our Thursday morning school Mass. Suddenly this year, only two or three children per week are bringing donations. I am sincerely hoping that the majority of our families are not experiencing poverty to the level that they are unable to foster the spirit of giving in their children. If you cannot afford to send in an item, I definitely understand. But if students are not bringing items because they are simply forgetting to bring them, please remind them to put an item into their school bag Wednesday evenings.

<u>Tuition:</u> At this time of year, we begin to get nervous about outstanding tuition balances. Tax returns are starting to come back, and those families who have fallen behind should have been able to get caught up. Our school budget is similar to your home budget. If you don't receive your pay check, you have serious problems paying your bills. It is the same here. When you log into Smart Tuition to look at your Tuition account, this is a contract you have made with SSPP. If you do not make your payments, it is a big deal to us, as we can't pay our bills. Our church is not wealthy. They already give us a generous subsidy so that we can keep tuition as affordable as possible. They do not have extra funds to cover the lack of income from unpaid tuition. Please don't make SSPP the last bill you pay! On our part, we likely have the lowest school budget in the Diocese of Grand Rapids. We are very good stewards of our resources.

# SS. Peter and Paul School Board Budget Information 2018-2019

# Highlights

- The budget for the 2018-2019 school year for Preschool-8th grade will be \$512,505.
- Anticipated enrollment for the 2018-2019 school year is 108 students in grades preschool through eighth.
- The SS. Peter and Paul Education Foundation will be granting the school approximately \$55,000.00 towards tuition reduction for all families.
- Program highlights and changes include:
  - -3 year old/Young 4's program with a choice of 3 or 4 days per week
  - -4 year old/Young 5's program with a choice of 4 or 5 days per week
  - -continuation of the utilization of the Ionia Public Schools Band program for grades 6-8.
  - -continuation of the utilization of Ionia Intermediate School District for student services such as speech, educational testing, and consultation.
  - -continuation of our Spanish program in grades kindergarten through eighth
  - -continuation of student counseling services provided one half-day per week
  - -full-time Principal

### **Tuition**

The overall average cost of educating a K-8 student at SS. Peter and Paul School is approximately \$4,400. This cost is offset by fundraisers and the combined monies of the parish, and Education Foundation which grants the school approximately \$1,600 per each K-8 parishioner family. If your family does not need to utilize all or a portion of the parish/Foundation support, please pay the non-parishioner tuition amounts. Tuition for students is listed below.

## **Financial**

It is the goal of the school administration, the parish pastor, and the School Board of Directors to ensure that parishioners who wish to send their children SS. Peter and Paul School will be able to do so regardless of financial status.

For those families who wish to seek financial assistance, the application for scholarships is available through Smart Aid is available on the school website at www.ssppcatholic.com. The application process is confidential. Scholarships are currently available from three sources. For parishioners: The Diocese of Grand Rapids offers the Bishop Scholarship Fund for tuition assistance and funds are available from the parish O'Connor Scholarship Fund. For non-parishioners, there are funds available from the SS. Peter and Paul Scholarship Fund.

Many families also participate in a tuition reduction program through SS. Peter and Paul SCRIP program in which a certain percentage of purchases at retailers is deducted from school tuition bills quarterly. Information concerning the Scrip program is available through the school office.
