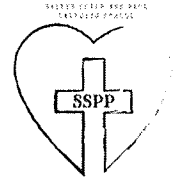

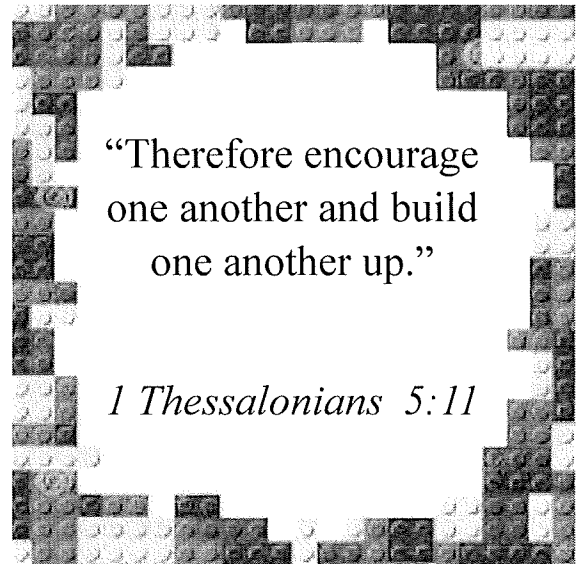

Conference Slips—Today in your oldest child's folder, you will find your scheduled conference time. Tuition: If you have not logged into your Smart Tuition account yet this year, please do so. It is important that all of our families stay current on their tuition. If you have any questions, contact the school office.

Cold Weather— Please be sure to send your child to school with all necessary outerwear for playing outside. It is the time of year that boots, hats, and mittens become necessary. Once the snow starts to fall, snow pants should also be worn. Students go outside each day unless the wind chill is zero degrees or colder. Please also consider sending a dress code sweater with your child, as the school building can be chilly in some rooms. Please be sure to label all of your child's items! Each year we seem to have several students with identical items!

Middle School Sledding— The Middle School students have expressed interest in having their own sledding day during lunch recess. Middle school students will be the only ones allowed to sled on Fridays. Elementary students will be allowed to sled all other weekdays during lunch and every day during morning recess if the conditions are right. In order to sled, middle school students must wear all proper snow gear.

Emergency Vehicles : Parents that are parking across the road from the school on Baldie Street to pick up their children are asked to please park in the parking lot or on the same side of Baldie Street as the school. If there was ever to be an emergency, a firetruck or ambulance would not fit down the street with vehicles on both sides.

24 Hour Rule—With flu season upon us, please be aware that students should be free fever for 24 hours, WITHOUT medication before returning to school. If your child has vomited, they may not return to school until they are 24 hours past the last time they vomited. These policies are in place to keep everyone as healthy as possible. Please do your part.
